Mayor's Words

At the Council meeting held on Tuesday 13th of this month we welcomed a report from Mr Ryan Viney, the CEO of RDAEP, in relation to the urgent need of child care facilities not only in our community but across the whole of the Eyre Peninsula. It was pleasing to see the issue of lack of childcare facilities being brought to the attention of everyone. The RDAEP will be taking this report to Federal Government in Canberra soon.

The recent activities at the Tumby Bay Jetty certainly gained valuable media attention; however, I cannot condone people going onto the jetty. I would remind everyone that the Jetty has been declared unsafe by SafeWork SA, and there is an order in place, officially from them, banning people from entering. As a result, it is a Police issue if people breach this order.

Council will be discussing future plans and costings of repairs or replacement of the Jetty next week. This meeting will be open to the public to attend if they desire. As everyone is concerned about the future of the Jetty, Council has decided to livestream this meeting to enable a greater audience to access the meeting. Please see meeting times and access details in this newsletter.

Wednesday the 14th of February saw the reopening of the Port Neill Hotel. The new owners, David and Helen are keen to have a fresh new start for the hotel and are keen to see it up and running. If you are in Port Neill, call into the Hotel and welcome David and Helen to the District.





Leo was born on 27 Dec 1912 at North Adelaide to William James Casey and Alice Maude Casey (nee Hatchard). There were two children in the family, a boy and a girl, of which he was the youngest. His mother died 5 years after his birth and Leo was raised by the Bishop family at Whyte-Yarcowie (near Terowie SA).

Little is known of his schooling. After leaving school he went to work as a shearer, mainly in the south east. In Dec 1937 he moved to Stokes to work as a beekeeper for Ern Smith and continued shearing in the area. On enlistment on 7 May 1940 he gave his occupation as farm labourer and his sister as next of kin

Leo marched into Wayville for processing and training on 23 May 1940. At the completion of training he was given pre embarkation leave. On return from leave he was allotted to 2/10th Battalion (Bn); he embarked from Adelaide aboard HMT "Stratheden" bound for the Middle East, disembarking at Suez on 31 Dec 1940. A week later he was reposted to 2/9th Bn and was taken on strength by his new unit on 9 Jan 1941.

The 2/9th Bn was raised in Qld on 13 Nov 1939 and was initially sent to UK in 1940 to help defend against a possible German invasion, before being sent to the Middle East in Nov 1940. It was in the Middle East that Leo joined his unit on 11 Jan 41 in time to take part in its first major battle in the war on 21 March 1941, at Giarabub, where the garrison surrendered; 250 Italians were killed, while 1,300 were taken prisoner of war. A month later the 2/9th was transported to Tobruk to reinforce the garrison there as German forces surrounded the strategic port. The 2/9th remained there for the next five months. On 21 Jun 1941, whilst his unit was still in Tobruk he was admitted to 4th Australian General Hospital (AGH) with Malaria, but returned to his unit 2 weeks later. In early 1942 the 2/9th returned to defend Australia. Leo, with his Bn, embarked on "Niew Amsterdam" Suez on 12 Feb 1942, disembarking at Adelaide on 28 Mar 1942. The Bn was given a short period of leave before regrouping in Qld, where it was re-organised and re-trained for jungle warfare.

On 7 Aug 1942 the Bn embarked at Brisbane bound for PNG, disembarking at Port Moresby. The Bn fought at Milne Bay in Sep 1942, the Buna-Gona actions in Dec 1942 and at Sananda. The impact of the fighting and tropical diseases in PNG resulted in only 89 men fit for action when the Bn was withdrawn to Port Moresby in the first week of Feb 1943. Leo was one of the casualties, having been evacuated, again with Malaria. On 10 Mar 1943 the Bn embarked at Port Moresby for return to Australia, disembarking at Cairns on 12 Mar 1943 for a period of rest, reinforcement and retraining.

The Bn returned to PNG in late 1943, embarking aboard "Van der Lynn" at Townsville on 6 Sep 1943, disembarking at Port Moresby on 11 Sep 1943. It then took part in the advance through the Finisterre Range, including the Battle of Shaggy Ridge in 1943–1944. The Bn then returned to Australia for rest and retraining, embarking on "Kota Baru" on 23 May 1944 and disembarking at Brisbane on 28 May 1944; again Leo was admitted to hospital with Malaria, this time 2nd AGH in Aug 1944.

On 25 May 1945 the Bn was on the move again, embarking at Cairns aboard "LST 753", disembarking at Moratai and training for amphibious landings as a prelude to their last action of the war. On 24 Jun 1945 the Bn embarked at Moratai aboard "LST 911" for Borneo, disembarking at Balikpapan on 1 Jul 1945. It was during this action that Leo was promoted to Corporal.

The war in the Pacific ended on 15 Aug 1945 and troops were progressively returned to Australia. Leo embarked on 2 Nov 1945 for return to Australia aboard HMT "Cheshire", disembarking at Melbourne on 7 Nov 1945.

He took his discharge in SA on 27 Nov 1945 and returned to Stokes in Feb 1946, bringing with him an ex-Army Chev 4WD truck. He used this vehicle to carry goods from Tumby Bay to Yallunda Flat store for many years.

In 1948 he married Mavis Dawn Provis at Stokes. They had 2 sons, Peter and Trevor, before moving to live in Port Lincoln in the early 1950s. Leo died at Port Lincoln on 11 Aug 1990 and is buried in the RSL Cemetery at Happy Valley. His wife's ashes were interred with him.

Equine Road Safety Share the Road, Safely, Together

The District Council of Tumby Bay has recently become aware of several close calls involving vehicles and horse riders in our district. It's essential for us all to recognise the vulnerability of horse riders on the road and take measures to ensure their safety. By practicing courtesy, common sense and adhering to road rules, we can collectively minimize the risk of conflicts and promote a safer community for everyone.

DID YOU KNOW?

• Horses are legally considered vehicles under road traffic laws, and riders hold the same rights and responsibilities as other drivers.

 Besides roads, horses are permitted on nature strips and footpaths, but riders must yield to pedestrians in these areas.

• On roads, horse riders are obligated to follow the Australian Road Rules and use hand signals to communicate their intended movements to other road users.

WHAT CAN MOTORISTS DO TO MINIMIZE RISKS?

Reduce Speed: Slow down when encountering a horse on or near the road. Even seasoned horses can be startled by fast or unexpected vehicle movements. **Observe Speed Limits:** Stick to recommended speeds of 25 km/h in urban areas and adjust your speed as necessary to ensure safety in rural areas when passing horse riders.

Provide Ample Space: Give as much space as possible when passing horse riders to prevent unnecessary stress for both the rider and the horse.

Avoid Disturbances: Refrain from accelerating, revving your engine, or using your horn in the vicinity of horses, as these actions can startle them.

Exercise Caution: If a horse appears unsettled, slow down further, or come to a complete stop until the rider signals that it is safe to proceed.

Stay Alert: When approaching a horse, pay close attention to potential sudden movements, unexpected behaviors, or signals from the rider.

Let's work together to create a community where all road users, including our equine companions, can safely coexist. Your cooperation in following these guidelines will contribute to a safer environment for everyone.
