MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings to you all, and Merry Christmas! With more COVID-19 restrictions being lifted, I am optimistic we may have more opportunity to spend time with friends and family this Christmas and new year period. 2020 has been a busy and challenging year for our council and community, but it has been encouraging how we've been able to work through the challenges, supporting each other when needed. We are unfortunately still seeing some community events not able to go ahead with the prescriptive nature of COVID restrictions, but there are others planning to change their structure to accommodate these extra requirements.

Port projects: We are continuing to be in the unique position of having two significant deep-sea port proposals advancing within our council district. Council continues to be proactive with its feedback and engagement with the proponents of both Cape Hardy and Port Spencer, to ensure the best outcomes are delivered for its community. As well as this, we are continuing to engage with decision makers at both State and Federal level to ensure proper processes are followed, and that the infrastructure requirements which go along with such proposed projects are understood.

COMPLIANCE UPDATE

Animal management

A reminder to all dog owners who still have unregistered dog(s), the following will apply;

- You will be issued an expiation, for the offence
- A reminder letter will be issued for expiations not paid by the due date, and a \$65 administration fee will be applied
- Non-compliance with details in the reminder letter will have their expiations forwarded to the Fines Enforcement and Recovery Unit, which will also incur additional fees, and include more severe consequences

Fire prevention

To the residents who have already had their properties attended to, please keep in mind it will be necessary to attend to any regrowth.

A reminder Schedule 12 – Section 105F notice has been issued to properties found to be non-compliant. The following applies from 4 January 2021.

- you may incur an expiation for non-compliance of \$315; and
- an authorised person may proceed to have the work required in the notice completed by a contractor at the property owner's expense.


NOTICE OF ROAD CLOSURE

Pursuant to section 33 of the Road Traffic Act, Council closes the following roads within Tumby Bay. Wibberley Street from Freeman Street to Esplanade, Esplanade from Wibberley Street to North Terrace, North Terrace from Esplanade to Spencer Street, Lipson Road at the intersection with North Terrace, Spencer Street between North Terrace and South Terrace, Mortlock Street between Spencer Street and Tumby Terrace, Tumby Terrace between Mortlock Street and North Terrace between 6pm to 8pm on Friday 18 December 2020 for the 2020 Christmas Pageant.

Persons taking part in the Christmas Celebrations on the above roads are exempted from all Australian Road rules relating to carriage of persons on vehicles, seatbelts and pedestrian behaviour.

NEW YEAR'S EVE DRY ZONES - TUMBY BAY AND PORT NEILL

In the interest of public safety and in an effort to minimise anti-social and criminal activity on New Year's Eve (2020), District Council of Tumby Bay has allocated temporary dry zones in Tumby Bay and Port Neill as shown below, between 9pm 31 December 2021 and 8am 1 January 2021.

DISABILITY ACCESS AND INCLUSION PLAN OUT FOR YOUR COMMENT

The District Council of Tumby Bay invites your input as it aligns with a Statewide push to reduce barriers faced by people living with a disability.

The DCTB draft Disability Access and Inclusion Plan is now out for public consultation - available online at www.tumbybay.sa.gov.au or in hard copy at the council office in Tumby Bay.

Mayor Sam Telfer said bringing in the Disability Access and Inclusion Plan was a great initiative that South Australian councils were all taking very seriously.

"The District Council of Tumby Bay has placed high priority on liveability in our communities for people of all ages, abilities and lifestyles," Mayor Telfer said.

"We're also demonstrating this with one of our long-term projects - the Living Well 2021 project is running until December 2021.

"It is investigating how liveable our towns are in terms of accessibility, connectivity, social engagement, inclusion and many other factors.

"We have community consultation happening via a comprehensive online and paper survey that has had fantastic response, and early next year we will have an audit done on accessibility and liveability in Tumby Bay and Port Neill.

"The data we get will be very valuable to us as a council as we identify what areas and projects we need to work on, to make sure our communities are as liveable as possible for everyone."



What is "Inclusive SA" ?

Inclusive SA was launched on 1 November 2019 and is the South Australian Government's first State Disability Inclusion Plan. The plan brings State Government agencies and local councils together to reduce the barriers faced by people living with disability.

Inclusive SA sets out priorities and actions under themes of:

- **inclusive communities for all**
- **leadership and collaboration**
- **accessible communities**
- **learning and employment**

The priorities and actions set out in Inclusive SA are first steps to improving access and inclusion for people living with disability.

Living Well is a 12 month project for the District Council of Tumby Bay, with a committee continuing to advise Council beyond that. The project is supported by an Age Friendly SA Grant, from Office for Ageing Well, SA Health.

TRELOAR'S LAST TERM

After 12 years serving the Eyre Peninsula, Member for Flinders Peter Treloar has announced he will not seek re-election in the March 2022 State Election.

"I have thoroughly enjoyed my time, and am grateful for the confidence and support given to me. I look forward to the remaining 16 months, with many more kilometres to travel yet," he said.

DCTB Mayor Sam Telfer said Mr Treloar has been a hardworking and conscientious local member for the region.

"He has always been willing to listen to the concerns of our community and do what he can to solve any challenges. Most importantly he's been a man of integrity and balanced perspective."



BEST OF BAY, STATE ON SHOW IN MARCH FESTIVAL

An exciting, one-off collaboration in Tumby Bay on March long weekend 2021 will incorporate the town's favourite events and a statewide festival.

Combining Colour Tumby Street Art Festival, Market @ The Bay, the Road Runners annual vintage car club gathering, @ The Bay seeks to deliver a COVID safe alternative to previous formats.

Excitingly Tumby is also an official Adelaide Fringe venue that weekend and will enjoy a number of performances including a "Sinatra & Friends" cabaret show by a young male duo, and one of Australia's most thought-provoking and life-affirming speakers, London terrorist bombing survivor Dr Gill Hicks.

District Council of Tumby Bay community development officer Amy Williams said in an uncertain environment for events, where COVID has seen many local events, markets and gatherings cancelled, innovation was vital.

Previously held on Tumby Bay foreshore, the market element of the event will become a "wandering market", with stalls spread along a trail within the town centre, which also takes in street art walls painted at previous Colour Tumby festivals as well as 3-4 new walls to be painted during the event.

The Tumby Bay Road Runners club will follow tradition and host a showcase of vintage cars along the stunning foreshore, where festival goers will find food stalls and be able to sit on the lawns and take in the bay views.

PORT NEILL FORESHORE WIFI UPGRADED TO 4G

Port Neill foreshore's free wi-fi is being upgraded to 4G reception standard.

The area was one of 60 locations to have a wifi node installed in 2018 by the South Australian Tourism Commission and Telstra AIR, to allow "connected travellers to journey further" and to more easily share their travel experiences online using the hashtag #SeeSouthAustralia.

Port Neill Progress Association President Mark Pfitzner said many visitors used it so it was great to see the technology being kept up to date.

Tumby Bay Hospital Auxiliary's last 2020 meeting heard from EO DON Sara Kempster that restrictions at the hospital remained in place and with rules changing often and quickly, those visiting should be aware co-operation will be enforced and appreciated.

Sara said a new registered nurse has been employed at Tumby Bay Hospital, and a new Uringa Hostel manager is being recruited, with outgoing manager Jordie Caulfield now manager of Cummins nurse's unit until April/May 2021.

In her last Uringa report, Jordie said she looked forward to her new role and hoped to be back in Tumby Bay in future. She told auxiliary members their recently purchased AED was installed and available to staff and visitors, while residents all have a personal safety, health alert device. She has entered Uringa Gardens in the local Christmas lights competition and encouraged all to view its display.

Sara reported SA Health recently funded replacement of the ancient hot water service and door intercom upgrades at Tumby Hospital. The hospital's next accreditation is in March 2021.

Meanwhile, Sara has passed her first anniversary as EO DON at Tumby Bay and Cummins Hospitals despite only planning to stay one month. She thanked the community for their ongoing support in a very remarkable year.

Auxiliary received a generous donation, after the closure of Tumby Bay Activities' Group; we are very thankful. Members agreed to give a donation to TB Lions, towards the Christmas Pageant 2020 event.

Next meeting and AGM will be 1.30pm, Wednesday 3 February 2021 at Bayview Medical Centre community health meeting room. Anyone is welcome to join and help raise funds for Tumby Bay Hospital and Uringa (Aged Care) Hostel.




A Soldier's Story

THEIR SERVICE / OUR HERITAGE - OUR PAST / YOUR FUTURE

After many stories of the actions of service men and women from our district, many depicting the horrors of war, a "good news" story emphasising the strength of our community, in time for Christmas.

The RSA, which later became the RSL, was formed in 1916 by troops returning from war: initially these organizations were state based, but by Nov 1916 it was agreed a National organisation was required; to be recognized by government as the official representative of returned servicemen and women. The aims were simple: to preserve the spirit of mateship formed amidst the carnage of war, to honour the memory of the fallen and to help each other.

These tenets remain as true today as they did at the founding of the League, a hundred years ago.

The inaugural meeting regarding formation of the Port Neill group was chaired by Mr. P.D.S.Cooper, a Boer war and WW1 veteran, at Port Neill on 22 May 1919. Prior to this, all returned servicemen from the district attended Tumby Bay or Cleve Sub Branches.

The meeting decided to apply to the RSL State Branch in Adelaide for formation of a Sub Branch at Port Neill, the first president to be Mr. Cooper.

The application was granted and the charter presented by RSL State branch Vice President Mr. R. Wilson MP, in Oct 1951 at the first annual dinner of the Sub Branch. The Sub Branch was very active, meeting on the first Tuesday of each month, followed by a general get together for members including darts and indoor bowls. The RSL Ball became an annual event also in the Port Neill Hall.

In 1953 it was proposed the Club construct a Club rooms, but because of limited funds it was decided to continue using the Port Neill Football Club Rooms; this continued until 1997, when meetings were transferred to the Port Neill Hotel.

In 1956 the Sub Branch was renamed the Port Neill/Wharminda Sub Branch and meetings were held alternately at Port Neill and Wharminda, as were the Annual Dinners, which later became Annual Luncheons. An illuminated cross was donated by Mr. A.E. (Ern) Masters for use at meetings held at Wharminda.

In 1958 a women's Auxiliary was formed, with Mrs. J. Kinlough as inaugural President.



In 1959 it was decided to purchase a shack site on the foreshore at Port Neill. A building fund was established and, in the traditional way of the time, cropping and cash donations were offered by members and the public.

The shack was constructed and ready for letting in 1961 to both members and the general public; members being given priority.

This was a brilliant scheme, where any profits raised were donated to charitable organisations.

A large donation was also made to the Tumby Bay Homes for the Aged. The shacks were sold in 1977.

In 1992 Ray and Yvonne Smith donated a flag pole to the Club; it was located at the hall and a plaque attached acknowledging the donation. On the closure of the Club the flagpole was relocated to an area near the Information Gazebo in Wallis St.

Also the illuminated Cross was donated to the Tumby Bay Sub Branch and is still in use today.

In 2001 the Sub Branch celebrated 50 years of service with a special luncheon; Harry Nijhuis lit 50 candles on a cake and the oldest member, Blue Tregilgas, was given the honour of extinguishing them.

Like many clubs the Sub Branch was experiencing a marked decline in membership. It was decided to close the Club and its affairs were wound up in May 2004, with almost \$4,000 donated to local charities and the Royal Flying Doctor Service. The closure does not mean the sacrifice and efforts of our servicemen and women has been forgotten.

The Club played an important part in the history of the two townships; the closing of the Club ended another chapter in that history. Three members of the Club were awarded Life Membership of the RSL. They were: Mr. C.F Chilman, Mr. T.D Rodda and Mr. A.E Masters.
