MAYOR'S MESSAGE

This last month has seen visits from some of our State representatives. I hosted a visit from Minister of Infrastructure and Transport, Corey Wingard, during which we covered a number of different topics. We visited both the proposed port locations, highlighting the challenges and opportunities we have as both a region and council area if they were to advance. Any potential change to grain freight movements would have a significant impact on council-managed roads, and there is a clear responsibility of the State if this were to happen. I also discussed with Minister Wingard the funding challenges we face in regards to the long-term future of the jetties within our town. Subsequent to the meeting, I reiterated these challenges to the Minister through a detailed letter, which highlighted some specific structural issues we face.

Our region was also visited by the Minister for Primary Industries David Basham. The predominant issue encapsulated during his visit was reforms to the marine scale fishery arrangements, currently being developed. Although this isn't a major issue in our district, it would have a significant impact upon our region as a whole, especially the West Coast. After this meeting, it was encouraging to see some changes made to better reflect the industry and scenario on the West Coast.

Dog & Cat Management Act 1995 – Sect: 45A (6)
A person who owns or is responsible for the control of a dog (not being an accredited assistance dog) is guilty of an offence if the dog defecates in a public place and the person responsible for the control of the dog does not immediately remove the faeces and dispose of them in a lawful and suitable manner. (Expiation Fee: \$210.)

Anyone who witnesses an offence like this, please contact Compliance Officer Trevor Franklin with details so that it maybe swiftly dealt with, would be appreciated by all users of this town facility.

FIRE SEASON PREP

COMPLIANCE OFFICER TREVOR FRANKLIN

Block inspections due to start towards the end of October will start mid-November due to rain in the previous month.

Residents who already had their properties attended to, please attend any regrowth. Properties found non-compliant on second inspection will be issued a Schedule 12 – Section 105F notice: (a) you may incur an expiation of \$315; and (b) an authorised person may have the work required in the notice completed by a contractor at the property owner's expense.

In 2019 Council adopted Policy 6.03 to allow vegetation burning in township areas, outside of the fire danger season, with these conditions:

- Vegetation must have originated from the property - **if it didn't grow there, it can't be burnt there.**
- No vegetation burning on a **Sunday or public holiday.**
- Vegetation burning **only** between 12 noon and 6pm.
- Vegetation stockpiles **no larger** than 2m x 2m x 1m high with a clearance of at least 4m around and above each stockpile.
- Anything other than dry, mature vegetation **prohibited from being burnt at any time.**
- Prohibited materials include cardboard, paper, general waste, green garden waste, plastic, tyres and treated timber **prohibited from being burnt at any time.**

If in doubt contact the council office, Copies of the policy and formal notice are available on Council's website.

Conducting burning activities in the open other than in accordance with Council Policy 6.03 is an offence to which a maximum penalty of \$4,000 and an expiation fee of \$300 applies.





remembrance day



Remembrance is not only about those whose lives were cut short, but those whose lives were damaged beyond repair.

At the Remembrance Day service at Tumby Bay foreshore Petty Officer Paul Sheehan highlighted war's effect on mental health in years past and today.

"We remember all fallen, and broken people" he said. "Some came back, found different careers, others came back broken. They carry these scars forever."

Newly elected RSL president Rob McKeown in his welcome, gave nod to traditional owners, the Naou people, and their spiritual relationship with country.

"We also acknowledge the Naou people as the traditional custodians of the Lower Eyre Peninsula and that their cultural and heritage beliefs remain important to the living Naou people today.

"This day is set aside to remember the sacrifice of those who have died or been injured for Australia in wars and conflicts. To share the traditions built on their foundation, to reflect the heritage they have passed on in their sacrifice."

After the service at the Tumby Bay RSL Mr McKeown and other members thanked Graeme Noske for his 6 years as Tumby Bay RSL president.

"When I took on the presidency here I didn't know my grandfather was actually the first president, so it was an honour to be president for the centenary," Mr Noske said.

PARKINSON'S NUMBERS ON THE RISE IN EP - TUMBY SUPPORT GROUP LOOKS TO RESTART

Parkinson's sufferers in Tumby Bay and the wider EP hope to restart a support group and attract a dedicated Parkinson's nurse, as prevalence of the disease steadily climbs.

Until 2019, Tumby Bay had an established and active Parkinson's support group helping people all over the Eyre Peninsula even as far as Cleve and Wudinna. It was the only one of its kind until a group started in Whyalla.

When Parkinson's SA lost its funding, the Tumby Bay group lost its support, its connection with a Parkinson's nurse, and ability to operate as an insured entity.

But a growing number of EP locals are living with Parkinson's, according to Tumby Bay's Tash Clark – well known local advocate. She said they need a dedicated Parkinson's nurse, and to meet and support each other.

"We know of 30 plus people in Tumby Bay, but there would have to be at least another 30 we don't know of," Ms Clark said.

Carers and patients are still unofficially meeting but want to restart the group. Ms Clark said representations made to politicians including SA Health and Wellbeing Minister Stephen Wade and Peter Treloar MP, have been well received.

Ms Clark said Parkinson's can start in middle age but, degenerative nature, often forces sufferers into residential care and Tumby Bay's limited capacity for that was worrying.

"We have a very high prevalence of neurological conditions here, and for whatever reason it's increasing (among our population) - there is a wave coming."

Paul Christie was diagnosed with Parkinson's in recent months and said connecting other sufferers helped him understand what he now lives with.

"The biggest thing is coming to terms with it," he said.

Mr Christie said the right treatment and advice was transformational.

"I suffered really badly for five months before moving to Tumby Bay, where I saw a doctor here who understood Parkinson's, because he sees so much of it. and with the right medication, it's completely changed my life."

Auxiliary thanks the Prime family for a much appreciated \$2,000 donation following their recent ram sale.



A Soldier's Story

Ern was born in 1895 at Wokurna (near Port Broughton, SA) to Albert Masters and Katherine Gertrude Masters (nee Smith). He was the eldest of 8 children in the family. His father was a farmer at Barunga North (near Snowtown).

Ern went to school in the Wokurna area. On completion of schooling he undertook employ on the family farm until his enlistment in the Army on 29 February 1916 at the age of 20 years. At the time he entered his occupation as farmer and his address as Barunga North.

After enlistment in Adelaide he was sent to 2nd Depot Battalion (Bn) for recruit training; during which he was posted to 50th Bn.

At the completion of training he embarked aboard HMAT "Aeneas" on 11 Apr 1916, bound for the Middle East, disembarking on 27 May 1916 and moving to Te-el-Kebir (Egypt) and taken on strength by his unit (50th Bn).

The 50th Bn had been raised in Egypt on 26 February 1916 as part of the "doubling" of the AIF. Approximately half of its strength was fresh recruits predominantly from S.A. The Bn, embarked at Alexandria (Egypt) on 5 June 1916, disembarking at Marseilles (Fr) on 11 June 1916.

The Bn fought its first major battle at Mouquet Farm, 13-15 August 1916, and suffered heavily. Ern was wounded in action (WIA) during this battle and was admitted to 12th Field Ambulance on 16 August 1916 with shrapnel wounds. He rejoined his unit a week later.

The harsh winter of 1916-17 saw Ern again admitted to hospital, this time with bronchiopneumonia. He was classified seriously ill and evacuated from Le Havre (Fr) to UK aboard the HS "Formosa" and admitted to 3rd London General Hospital on 23 November 1916 where he remained until 16 December 1916, when he was transferred to 3rd Auxiliary Hospital in London.

He was released on 19 January 1917 and embarked from Folkstone (UK) aboard the SS "Princess Clementine" on 2 February 1917 bound for Etaples (Fr); he returned to his unit 10 February 1917.

His stay was short as he was again admitted to hospital on 28 March 1917 with shell concussion. He returned to his unit on 18 April 1917, just after his unit's involvement in the attack on Noreuil. On 26 May 1917 he was promoted to Lance Corporal.

The Bn moved to the Ypres (Belgium) sector and was involved in the battle of Messines 7-12 June 1917 and the battle of Polygon Wood 26 September 1917.

During this battle, Ern was again WIA and evacuated to 12 Field Ambulance with shrapnel wounds and remained there a week before returning to his unit.

On 11 February 1918 he reported sick with dysentery. He was admitted to 14th Static Hospital at Bologne (Fr) before being evacuated aboard HS "St. David" to UK and admitted to Addington Park War Hospital. Unfortunately his health remained poor and he contracted severe influenza and was admitted to Fovant Hospital, on 26 July 1918. He remained there for over 3 months before being released and given recuperation leave until 16 January 1919, when he was attached to the Divisional Training Depot. On 19 February 1919 he embarked aboard the SS "Orca" at Liverpool for return to Australia, disembarking in Adelaide on 5 April 1919 and taking his discharge on 20 May 1919. Ern returned to Barunga where he resumed work on the family farm and other farms in the area in an effort to raise enough money to purchase his own farm. On 6 March 1923 he married Ivy Ellen Davies at the Wokurna Methodist Church. As a wedding gift his mother in law gave him a farm at Barunga, Section 255, Hd of Wiltunga.

He purchased his farm of 1500 acres (600 Ha), at Wharminda - Sect 9, Hd of Verran - in 1928. The couple settled on it to raise a family of 5 children, 3 boys and 2 girls. This was referred to as the "home" farm. A short time later he purchased bought ximately two miles (3 Km) apart. Both blocks were partly cleared; the home farm remains in the family today.

Ern was a staunch supporter of Port Neill/Wharminda RSL and was recognised with a Life Membership. He regularly travelled to Adelaide for Anzac Day marches, seldom missing a march and a reunion with his Bn mates.

Ern's wife died suddenly on 12 September 1954 when the children were still quite young. She was buried in the Verran Cemetery. He remained on the farm until he retired to Port Neill; he died on 19 August 1975 and is buried in the Verran Cemetery. He rests beside his wife.
